## Robbers cart away electronics worth Sh16m from shop

In a shocking robbery incident, a daring gang on Saturday night broke into a computer shop and carted away items worth Sh16 million.

In an incident that was captured on CCTV cameras, it is suspected the gang drugged the security guards at Twigia Towers.

They were seen carting away computers and mobile phones all valued at Sh16 million which the victim said he bought them on credit.

The footage obtained from the shop captured one of the suspects talking to the security guard around 9 pm on Saturday night before dragging him away in what was suspected the watchman had lost consciousness.

Even though the case has been reported at Central Police Station, some witnesses who spoke to *The Standard* said the manner in which the robbery was carried out could be a case of business rivalry or an inside job.

"I think it has something to do with inside job or business rivalry because the robbers took their time to break into the shop," Andrew Kibe, one of the traders in an opposite shop said.

# New rules for recruiting senior school teachers

► Fifty one subject combinations will determine eligibility for employment.

► The subjects are grouped into five categories: Science, Languages, Mathematics, Humanities and Technical.

The Teachers Service Commission has tightened rules on recruitment of senior secondary school teachers, unveiling 51 approved subject combinations that will determine who qualifies for employment under the Competency-Based Education (CBE), and warning that those trained outside the list risk being locked out of teaching jobs.

The teachers' employer in a notice dated April 10, stated that only teachers trained in the approved subject combinations will be registered and considered for employment in senior schools, effectively

locking out graduates whose training falls outside the prescribed pairing list.

The subject combination will shape training, registration, and recruitment under the Competency-Based Education (CBE), according to the notice.

"TSC has approved subject combinations for training, registration, and recruitment of secondary school teachers. These combinations determine eligibility for employment in public secondary schools. Only candidates with these approved combinations qualify for TSC registration and recruitment. Candidates pursuing unapproved combinations may be ineligible for employment," the notice by the director staffing Antonina Lentoijoni reads.

The approved combinations have been grouped into five broad categories: Science, Languages, Mathematics, Humanities, and Technical subjects, with Language emerging as the largest group while Mathematics has the fewest approved pairings.

At the same time, TSC is working with the Ministry of Education to train teachers who will teach Chinese, as the implementation of foreign languages faces a major teacher shortage.

The Language category has the most combinations, while Mathematics has the fewest.

TSC said the move is aimed at reducing confusion in hiring, ensuring all subjects are adequately covered in schools, and guiding training institutions on appropriate subject pairings for senior school specialisation pathways.

The Language group leads with 14 combinations, including English paired with Literature, and Kiswahili combined with subjects such as CRE, History, Geography, IRE, Home Science, and Physical Education.

In the Mathematics category, six combinations have been approved. These include Mathematics paired with Business Studies, Geography, Computer Studies, Chemistry, Biology and Physics.

## Court gives Orwoba lifeline to challenge expulsion from UDA

The High Court in Nairobi has granted former Senator Gloria Orwoba a lifeline to pursue the United Democratic Alliance (UDA) for expelling her and subsequent removal from Senate despite there being orders not to by the Political Parties Disputes Tribunal (PPDT).

Justice Linus Kassan in his ruling, said that although the UDA electoral nomination and dispute resolution committee sued Orwoba, her accuser, Festus Omwamba and Henry Muriithi, the orders by the tribunal were against the main party.

He said that the fear of the committee being cited for contempt of orders was not a reason enough for the court to intervene or suspend the PPDT orders.

"The court believes that the applicant has failed to demonstrate substantial loss should this court fail to grant an order of stay of execution pending appeal. It is trite that substantial loss in its various forms is the cornerstone of the court's jurisdiction for granting a stay, and is what has to be prevented," said Justice Kassan.

PPDT had nullified her expulsion, declaring the process unlawful.

**The Equalisation Fund Appropriation Bill, 2025 (National Assembly Bills No. 21 of 2025)  
The County Governments Additional Allocations Bill, 2026 (Senate Bills No. 8 of 2026)**

The Equalisation Fund Appropriation Bill, 2025 (National Assembly Bills No. 21 of 2025) and the County Governments Additional Allocations Bill, 2026 (Senate Bills No. 8 of 2026) were read a First Time in the Senate on Thursday, 2<sup>nd</sup> April, 2026.

The Bills thereafter stood committed to the Standing Committee on Finance and Budget for consideration. The Committee is required, pursuant to standing order 145(5) of the Senate Standing Orders, to facilitate public participation on the Bills and to take into account the views and recommendations of the public when the Committee makes its reports on the Bills to the Senate.

**The Equalisation Fund Appropriation Bill, 2025 (National Assembly Bills No. 21 of 2025)** seeks to authorize issuance of a sum of Ksh. 16,800,000,000 out of the Equalisation Fund and its application towards provision of public basic services for Financial Year 2025/2026.

**The County Governments Additional Allocations Bill, 2026 (Senate Bills No. 8 of 2026)** seeks to make provision for the transfer of conditional and unconditional allocations from the National Government's share of revenue and from proceeds of loans and grants from development partners to the county governments for Financial Year 2026/2027.

In accordance with the provisions of Article 118(1)(b) of the Constitution and standing order 145(5) of the Senate Standing Orders, the Standing Committee on Finance and Budget now invites interested members of the public to submit any representations that they may have on the Bills by way of written memoranda.
